Saturday 13th April

The Jewish Quarter in Prague contains the most well-preserved Jewish historical monuments in Europe, among them six synagogues, the historical Jewish Town Hall and the Old Jewish Cemetery. After that, we will take a look at the memorial for the heroes of the "heydrichiade".

Monday 15th April

Wednesday 17th April

Today we are leaving Prague to vistit the city Kutná Hora that is part of the UNESCO world heritage. Due to the exploitation of nearby silver mines in the 14th and 15th century, Kutná Hora became one of the richest cities of Europe, which allowed it to build prestigious monuments and churches. After already having spent several days in the "City of Gold", you will also get to visit the so-called "City of Silver".

Besides the silver mine we will also visit the Sedlec Ossuary, a Roman Catholic Church, where roughly 10.000 human bones were used to artistically decorate and furnish the premises.

Thursday 18th April

After breakfast, we will head to our busses to return to Berlin, Munich, Frankfurt, Dresden or Hamburg.







TRANSPORT TO PRAGUE ON 13TH APRIL 2019

We offer all students three different places of departure – Hamburg, Berlin, Frankfurt, Dresden or Munich. Please let us know from which city you want to leave and when exactly you are arriving at one of those train stations. We will collect you from the train station or ZOB (bus station) in each city. The transport to Hamburg, Berlin, Frankfurt, Dresden or Munich is not included in the price.

Hamburg: Meeting point is the Hamburg ZOB at 8.30 am. Departure of the bus to Prague is 9.45 am from the ZOB. In Berlin ZOB you have to change the buses. You will arrive there at 1 pm and take the bus to Prague at 2 pm Arrival in Prague ÚAN Florenc 6:25 pm (it's the station after Prague main station!).

Berlin: Meeting point is Berlin ZOB at 12 am. Departure of the bus to Prague is 2 pm from the ZOB – together with students from Hamburg. Arrival in Prague ÚAN Florenc 6:25 pm (it's the station after Prague main station!).

Frankfurt: Meeting point is the main station in Frankfurt (Main) at 8:15am. Departure of the bus to Prague is at 9:15am. Layover in Bayreuth from 1:30-2:05pm. Arrival in Prague ÚAN Florenc at 6:20pm (it's the station after Prague main station!).

Dresden: Meeting point is the main station in Dresden at 4:45pm. Departure of the bus to Prague is at 5:50pm. Arrival in Prague ÚAN Florenc at 8pm (it's the station after Prague main station!).

Munich: Meeting point is Munich ZOB at 2 pm. Departure of the bus to Prague is 3 pm (midday) from the ZOB. Arrival in Prague at ÚAN Florenc 8 pm (it's the station after Prague main station!).



TRANSPORT FROM PRAGUE ON 18TH APRIL 2019

We will take you back to Hamburg, Berlin, Frankfurt, Dresden or Munich and make sure you can catch your connecting trains or busses back home. To do that, we need the exact details about the transport connections you plan on taking.

Berlin: Arrival from Prague at 12.35 am in Berlin ZOB. Further connections from there should be booked starting at 1.30 pm.

Hamburg: Arrival from Prague around 5 pm at the ZOB (bus station). The connections from there should be booked starting at 6 pm from the central train station or ZOB.

Frankfurt: Arrival from Prague at 9.20 pm at Frankfurt (Main) main station. The connections from there should be booked starting at 10.30 pm.

Dresden: Arrival from Prague at 10.00 am at main station Dresden. The connections from there should be booked starting at 11.00am.

Munich: Arrival from Prague around 1.40 pm at the ZOB (bus station). The connections should be booked starting at 2.30 pm from the central train station or ZOB.

HOW CAN I PARTICIPATE IN THE TRIP?

- 1. Please fill out the registration form very carefully. You will need the signature of your parents and host family. The registration form contains important information, which we need because you are underage. That is why it is a bit longer than a normal online booking on the internet. - 2. After we have received the money, you will be sent a confirmation of participation.
- 3. You will receive an exact agenda of the trip and all the relevant information (what should I pack? etc.) This information is sent to you and your host family. Should the information not reach you, please contact the aubiko office in Hamburg.
- 4. Please plan and book your journey to and from Munich, Hamburg, Frankfurt, Dresden or Berlin and send us your arrival and departure details.
- 5. Save the aubiko emergency number and check if you have sent us your correct mobile phone number.
