Excellence: About 500 German universities offer excellent opportunities for studying and research.

No/ Low Fees: Unlike many other countries, no tuition fees are charged for undergraduate degrees at most of the public universities in Germany.

Some facts about German universities



Germany has **public** and **private** universities. They are usually divided into universities, universities of applied sciences and colleges of art, film and music. **About 95 percent of the universities are financed by the government and are therefore state-funded.** Only 5 percent of the institutions of higher education are private universities.

After the US and Great Britain Germany is the most popular location for studying abroad. Every tenth student is an international. In total we have more than 300.000 internationals.

How to apply?



Anyone wanting to study at a university in Germany needs a so-called "Hochschulzugangsberechtigung" (HZB), or higher education entrance qualification. The HZB you have, if:

You have a Bachelor


You have studied 2/4 semesters

You passed the "Feststellungsprüfung"



You need to pass a Feststellungsprüfung=HZB




You need to go a "Studienkolleg"



How to get a seat at a Studienkolleg?





Standard procedure:

- Get your High School Diploma
- Get fluent in German (B2)
- Apply for a seat at a German
 University from your home country
- Apply for a seat at many
 Studienkollegs by writing many exams, wait for the results
- Wait another 6 months, because there are not enough seats
- Go to the Studienkolleg for 12 months, pass the Feststellungsprüfung
- Apply for a seat at a University

PSP-program:

- Get your High School Diploma
- Take the test in your home country, get the result immediately
- Get your guaranteed seat at PSP ans receive your visa documents in time
- Pass the Feststellungsprüfung after
 12 months
- Apply for a seat at a university with aubikos support
- Start your study course at University
- Become a part of Germany

PSP and German



Normally prior knowledge of German is a requirement for joining the Studienkolleg (B2), however, we have created a program students with little or no knowledge of German can apply for.

Why? - Because Germany has a big need of qualified people.

How? – Our individual support starts right after the entrance test.



Feststellungsprüfung

The "Feststellungsprüfung" is an exam by the German State, which is necessary for students from most non-european countries. To prepare for the exam, you will need to complete a Foundation Year (Studienkolleg). If you choose to study engineering you will have lessons in German, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry (T-courses). For business studies, you will have lessons in German, Mathematics, Economics, Business Studies and English (W-courses).

After passing the "Feststellungsprüfung", you can apply at all German universities.



How to apply for PSP?



For the PSP you need to take an entrance examination (oral and written).

The test can only be held by a German certified examiner. The next test for Taiwanese applicants will take place in your home country. How does the test look like:

- 1. Written test for T and W-courses
- 2. Interview in English about students motivation
- 3. German: Students with German will be tested in German and be told which language level they have got.

After the test, each student gets an individual study plan for preparing you best for your PSP.
