# Introduction

University in Germany is a great opportunity for everyone who has the chance. Our high-quality universities are free and guarantees good job opportunities. To understand our system, it requires some guidance. So if your goal is to become part of the German university life, it can however be helpful to get a professional introduction to system.



In this course we will explain what you can study and how you can apply. The course is simultaneously also a language course, where we teach German. We will look at the application process – and try to write one. You learn how to apply for grants to help pay for living expenses or scholarships in another country. You will be shown around Hamburg with a personal guide. You get the opportunity to talk with German students about their university and what everyday student life looks like. E.g. how many classes are the taking, if it's easy to make friends or what living expenses they have. It will also be possible to talk with the International Offices.

## Requirements

- Number of participants: minimum 15 students
- The language level within a group of students should be approximately the same
- Computer with stable Internet connection

## What is included?

- 10 sessions of 90 minutes
- Well-educated and experienced teachers
- Intensive introduction of the German university system
- Language course with focus on “How to study in Germany”
- Explanation/exercises of the application process
- Meeting with International Offices
- Virtual sightseeing tour with an experienced guide
- Talk with actual university students
- Learning materials and online tools

## Possible program of 10 sessions, one session 90 minutes

1. Workshop and vocabulary part 1 “Hamburg”
2. Live broadcast of a tour of Hamburg, questions can be asked interactively in real time. Alternatively, Hamburg residents can be interviewed.
3. Workshop “How to understand the German university system”
4. Study opportunities in Hamburg
5. Workshop and vocabulary part 3 “Everyday life, apartment hunting, spare time, part-time job, etc”
6. Interviews with students in small groups “How to study in Germany”
7. Interviews with students in small groups “German student life”
8. Requirements for studying in Germany
9. Application training for studies in Germany
10. Interview with the staff in the International Office of the University Hamburg
